This course will help you develop a practical framework for approaching the assurance of cultural and ethical performance and enable you to deliver insight and value in your work.

Heads of audit, internal audit managers, senior internal auditors and internal auditors involved in planning and providing assurance on culture and ethics, or those wanting to find out more about internal audit developments in these emerging areas. It is particularly relevant for those wanting to add greater value and deliver enhanced insight through successful internal audit engagements.
